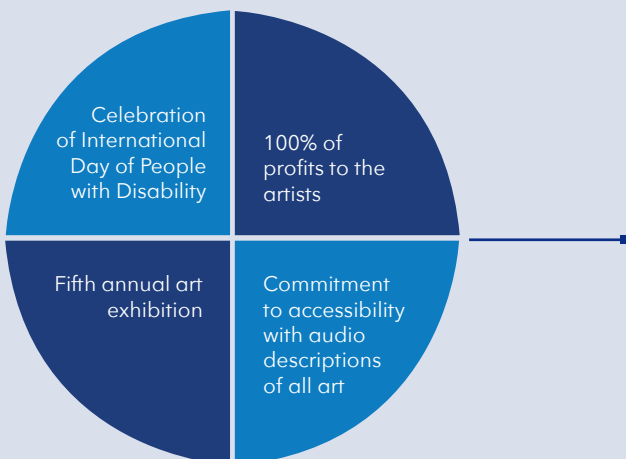

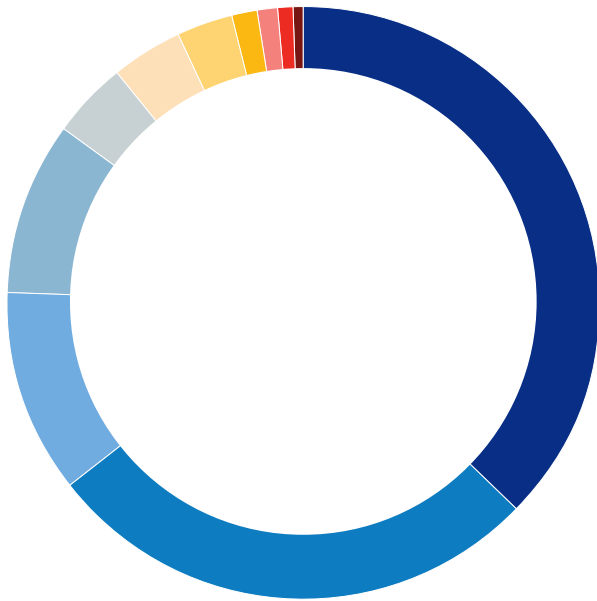


### 2019 ART EXHIBITION
